Anyone who has read my writing from when I started out in 2005, using the web to promote my work, will be aware that I've always taken time to publish pieces on what I call being a Proud African.

From when I started working as a high-flying employee in Guinness Nigeria where I conceived a variety of compelling innovations (e.g. over 4 custom automated Spreadsheet Software that replaced manual reporting) and derived formulas for better evaluating process management performance (e.g. a Brewhouse Efficiency formula I proposed to senior management in 1998), I'd found myself wondering why some people with skin colour similar to mine, often regarded me with awe, with some calling me "White" regarding my "attitude".

Most of them rarely accepted what I told them that they could produce the same exceptional results I did, if they would simply apply themselves.

This trend has continued since I became an entrepreneur in 2002. My accomplishments in custom Excel-VB software development, Web Marketing and Freelance Writing continue to make some people in my society, tell me I am more an exception than the norm.

Interestingly, I'm a relative nobody, in terms of what I've so far done. Many other Nigerians/Africans and Blacks elsewhere, though a minority, are achieving much more exceptional results in various fields! Our brothers and sisters however readily say the same things they say about me, about those others they see excelling in fields traditionally dominated by White people. Over the past decade or so, some Asian and other non-African persons who encountered my custom software and web marketing resources online, contact me - via Skype and phone - to verify if I am really black.

In 2008, a Singaporean Excel-VB developer insisted on calling my mobile to confirm that I was indeed based in Africa's Nigeria, after he watched videos of my Excel-VB apps (e.g. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IU14_RAja-g) back in 2008. If the bias of the above mentioned ill informed foreigners was easy to understand, that of my own people has been hard to endure!

I have lost count of Nigerians in particular who have, while speaking with me on phone asked if a White or Asian person was actually the person building the Excel-VB apps that I offered for sale. *Those that did not ask insinuated it!* Each time this happens I patiently refer them to my resume (see www.tayosolagbade.com/uploads/tayosolagbade.pdf) which shows that I did it in paid employment for 7 years (in my spare time as a brewer – as I was NOT employed to work in IT), before leaving for my business.

This problem happens because many black people grow up seeing mostly light skinned Asian/American) people being announced and celebrated as - *inventors and innovators* – in fields (especially intellectual) outside sports/entertainment (where blacks naturally excel).

It's so bad that most young blacks have great difficulty accepting that a black person can invent or innovate anything that others - especially from the developed world of whites - will accept as useful.

For this reason, they typically look down on, or disregard ideas, inventions and innovations they or their fellow blacks conceive, while readily embracing what light skinned people do as superior.

That's also why half-castes (from the union of a black and white or light skinned non-Africa) tends to get preferential treatment or favoured over pure black skinned persons in black societies – especially Africa.

Another dimension of this same problem is what makes many black females show self-hate by bleaching their skins and purchasing straight human hair (shaven from the heads of White/Asian females) at crazy prices.

I've always been driven to find out why we are this way – and why I have grown up feeling so different from most others who have a similar skin colour to mine.
