he idea I reveal below is the solution to poverty and unemployment anywhere.

Any school that teaches it will discover its graduates – who apply it diligently – will never beg for jobs, and rarely experience unemployment, talk less of poverty.

If you think that's a reckless claim, I challenge you to read this report to the end. Do it with an open mind. And by the time you're done, you'll see that I'm right.

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This powerful bit of insight is to be found in the **preface** of the original "Think and Grow Rich" – the all time bestseller written by Napoleon Hill.

Specifically the 5th paragraph.

Note that last phrase..."thousands of people in almost every walk of life".

Now that kind of money making secret is one that every person needs to know, because we are told by Mr. Hill that people from virtually all walks of life have used it successfully.

That means no matter who you are, or what you do, or where you're from, you CAN use it to achieve financial and personal success. NB: I should mention quickly here that I believe I can be counted as one of the thousands (actually millions today) who have put that secret formula to profitable use.

And THAT is why I've written this book: to help others "discover" the insights to do the same!

2. Mr. Hill noted that Mr. Andrew Carnegie - who became a millionaire using this same magic formula, proposed the idea of placing it...

"...within reach of people who do not have time to investigate how men make money"

Did you get that?



This wise, old and wealthy man knew some people would not have the time to research the money making process, but would be willing to learn from those who did it.

You will agree with me that he was thinking about everyday people, like you and me. Otherwise, how many of us could have committed more than 2 decades of our lives (like Hill did) to distil this amazing body of wisdom from hundreds of authentically successful - and busy - people?

Very few, it all any. And there would also have been the need to find someone with Andrew Carnegie's kind of influence, to open doors needed to gain access to the personalities you'd have needed to interview and study.

Looking back at the many hundreds of thousands of successful people in virtually all areas of endeavour (including religious leaders!), who have acknowledged that reading Think and Grow Rich contributed significantly to their demonstrated ability to succeed, it is obvious that Mr. Hill has indeed done that.

When I first read it, and it clicked I said "Wow!!!"

1. No wonder Henry Ford who starting out in business as a start illiterate, went on to employ well schooled engineers, who he then relentlessly *challenged* to build a revolutionary car engine that would make him a fortune!

2. No wonder Thomas Edison had only 3 months of schooling and yet achieved so much as an inventor/scientist, that his name remains indelible in mankind's history!

3. No wonder Robert Kiyosaki wrote books like "Rich Dad Poor Dad" and "If You Want to be Rich & Happy Don't Go to School?" and "Why A Students Work for C Students"...

4. No wonder Seth Godin wrote "Stop Killing Dreams"...regarding conventional schools.

5. No wonder Sir Ken Robinson keeps speaking and writing about how Schools Kill Creativity!

6. AND, NO WONDER I excelled in school, graduating as top student in my class from the university, narrowly missing first class by 0.1 (5.9 vs. 6.0), and then went on to excel in paid employment...BUT upon starting my own business, I LOOKED like a complete fool for many years (needing financial support from family to care for my kids), before I found my feet!

Il of the above, is why, for me, it is no surprise that so many graduates enter the society confused about what to do to succeed, despite all their years of studying in school.

The truth is they were/are not properly prepared by the formal schooling they got/get!

The above understanding has so shaped my attitude towards conventional formal schooling that I have been accused by relatives especially of making my kids careless about academic work, which would deny them access to the kind of education I got.

I replied that I did not want my kids to NOT care about academics. But I believed that as their father, I owe them a duty to help them adopt the right mindset about schooling, as it relates to the real world they will eventually enter.

For me, that means I must tap from my personal experiences and observations over the years, to offer them insights and guidance they can use.



y mother worked for over 30 years as a school teacher, and retired from one of Nigeria's leading private schools (Corona),

with a Montessori certification via a course she took.

She taught me and all my siblings at the early stages of our education.

As you can imagine, she initially also felt I was going about my plans regarding helping my kids get real world relevant education to complement their schooling, the wrong way.

> So I asked her to think about the way I'd had to struggle to find my feet in business. And how what I'd learnt in school had turned out to be of little use towards making headway to success that I sought.

Also about how I'd needed the insights from books on personal achievement, coupled with access to more predictable resources (e.g. power supply, Internet etc).

PLUS, how I'd also found a more conducive socio-economic environment in Benin Republic, compared to Nigeria.

How, ONLY after all the above happened had I begun to record the sustainable successes I desired!!

After I'd told her the above, she understood: that I was not saying my kids would not go to school. Instead, I want to make sure they did NOT make the mistake of thinking school would teach them everything they needed to know.

> ut Isn't Schooling Meant to Prepare Us to Succeed in the Real World?

Isn't that why we are made to attend school for so long? Well, that's the irony. It is – <u>but it does not</u>!

The only thing conventional schooling does well is to prepare us to work as employees.

In the past that was okay, because jobs were in abundance.

Today, the reverse is the case. And that's created a dilemma for school leavers. In the meantime, schools have continued without adapting to the major shift in the nature of demand – for most of them, the business of producing well schooled graduates remains just that: a business.

Like many before me have rightly said, our schools are still using the same methods that served the industrial age (where mass employment was available), in a radically different world that today demands drastically different competencies, if one is to be relevant and successful.

Answer: Simple. By NOT

uestion: So. Where Are The

INCLUDING the study and practice of "real world relevant" philosophies for achieving personal and financial success in the curriculum they use for teaching us!

You see, *IF* they were to adapt, from today, and begin including teaching of success "formula", like that advocated by Carnegie, and other relevant ones; and *IF* they made a point of inviting competent achievers from the real world, to complement their in-house teaching, their graduates would experience less confusion and succeed more with hard work, and NO anxiety.

My Personal Experiences, Observations & Achievements Confirm It!

That's why you're reading this special issue of my newsletter, on this subject. I am succeeding based on the use of that "magic formula". Yet, I NEVER heard or read about Napoleon Hill or his book till I graduated from the university!

And when I became an entrepreneur in 2002, that book provided me the insights to deal successfully with countless bouts of adversity over a decade, in one of the harshest socio-economic environments one can strive to succeed by running an ethical business i.e. Nigeria.

That book that gave me the needed inspiration, time and time again, when I felt I could no longer continue. It kept giving my subtle hints, and suggestions as I read and reread in my darkest hours - opened my inner eyes to new possibilities, until I finally realized I needed to change my environment - and I relocated here in Benin Republic.

Less than 2 years later, the book's wisdom has guided me to further build my brand to even greater **international** reckoning, leading to more buyers within/outside Africa for my products and services. And this progress has continued, despite what should have been a massive setback via the loss of my 9 year old **spontaneousdevelopment.com primary domain** on 4th May 2014.

> hen that loss occurred, most people would have been devastated – and probably given up.

But having read <u>THAT BOOK</u> countless times, during my darkest hours as an entrepreneur, the words that came to me were about how "<u>every</u> <u>adversity, no matter how serious carries the</u> <u>seed of an equivalent benefit</u>".

NB: It's the ability to think like that, when all your training and competence appears to have failed you, that WILL ensure you I inevitably succeed! They do NOT teach that in **school**. But it's part of the Magic Formula for success in the real world that Andrew Carnegie and Napoleon Hill distilled as into the contents of the book published by the latter.

Today, ALL my original content (initially published on "spontaneousdevelopment.com") is NOW being propagated from MY own personal domain name: tayosolagbade.com?

And that actually makes more sense, does it not!

Yet, if truth be told, I never once considered making the change, even though I'd purchased tayosolagbade.com over a year ago. Why? I was uncertain how it would affect my website's search engine visibility. Especially because of the importance Internet experts said Google attached to domain "age" in ranking websites.

Well, when the change of domain name was imposed on me (even if unfairly), I was forced to put tayosolagabade.com to use.

Guess what?

The only major difference I've noticed today, 3 full months after losing my 9 year old domain is that I get MUCH less traffic to my site daily, than before. I think that's mainly because most back links to my site from my syndicated content online lead to the spontaneousdevelopment.com URL.

On the other hand, as I have noted in a recent article, my Website Conversion Ratio has actually more than doubled since then!

As a result, I'm getting more serious sales leads and making more sales than I used to! <u>See how</u> <u>the point about adversity having an equivalent</u> <u>benefit works now?</u> hould people not learn this kind of useful philosophy as early as possible in life?

Of course they should. That way, they'll leave school doing less complaining and learning to pay the price to achieve authentic success.

They will come to understand that when things go wrong, it could be a sign that things are actually about to get better for them. But ONLY if they adopt the right mental attitude and take the right actions!

You see, failure and adversity are life's way of preparing up, moulding us, to develop the qualities we need to succeed e.g. persistence, endurance, courage, enthusiasm – under ANY situations, no matter how harsh, tough or difficult.

And I Have Seen The Same Thing In The Lives Of Others As Well

As a keen student of human nature, I have noticed that those who often struggle the most to flourish and achieve long term success/relevance IN SPITE of hardship or adversity, often tend to be the highly schooled persons.

It sounds contradictory, since one would expect such "well educated" people to KNOW better.

But unfortunately, many who emerge as successful students, often do so because they let "school" beats the creative and adaptive instincts out of most such people. They learn to give teachers what they want. And that often means giving up control of their minds – thinking less and memorising more. Accepting the teacher's word as final. Not adopting a curious disposition. In fact coming to abhor trying to independently explore/discover new knowledge!

> n contrast, people who are less schooled, or who while in school neglected (deliberately or by accident) to let themselves be completely moulded into conformance, are those

who emerge better prepared to take on the real world.

If you're willing to be objective, you'll see what I mean, when you think about it. Just look around in your society, and the trend will be obvious.

You see, we all graduate with similar qualifications – academically. But that is ONLY one aspect of what life demands in exchange for success.

The other often more important aspect is our willingness to diligently apply the philosophies for success achievement. The kind that reading "Think & Grow Rich" teaches, for example.

Since that is NOT something we learn on the way to acquiring a B.Sc, M.Sc, talk less a PhD, most graduates or formally schooled people enter the real world unaware that they lack it.

By the time they try to make their business ventures work, and the inevitable challenges come their academic qualifications offer them no respite.

For many, when this happens, they often get frustrated and eventually decide to give up.

But for those familiar with the philosophies, they take the steps they know need to be taken, all the while maintaining the required mental attitude. And eventually success, though often delayed, comes.

Of course, like everything else in life, there will be exceptions. But that is what they will be: exceptions. I am a product of the traditional schooling system.

KNOW what it feels like to be "called" brilliant all through school and in paid employment (which is really what conventional schooling prepares us for), and then to have myself mocked and ridiculed for looking like an idiot for years after choosing to go into business for myself. While passing through that painfully humiliating and heartbreaking experience, I began to question the formal education I'd received. learnt that my formal education was not bad or useless. But it was also NOT enough!

That discovery made me resolve to approach the task of schooling my kids in a different way from what my parents gave me.

It's however been hard to make relatives and close associates understand my purpose in that regard.

But I refuse to let that bother me. The results the kids achieve will reassure everyone who doubts that I know what I'm doing.

One thing is certain: I do NOT want to repeat the kind of schooling I got, for my kids. They need to have a better balanced education that will make them competent to succeed in the real world, from the start – be it in paid or self-employment.

I urge other parents to take ownership of the process of educating and coaching their kids for success in life. Stop leaving it all to the school teachers and administrators.
